CAPTAIN study



About the CAPTAIN Study

This study will test a triple therapy drug to see how effective and safe it is for treating asthma. We are testing a product that combines three medications into one inhaler. Participants will use the inhaler once a day, in the morning.

As a participant, you will be randomly assigned, like the flip of a coin, to receive either one of 4 different strengths of the investigational drug or 2 strengths of a double therapy drug. Neither you nor the study doctors will know which option you were assigned. It will only be revealed in an emergency.

The clinical study will last approximately 32 weeks. After an initial assessment period during the first couple weeks, you will receive your assigned drug. You also will receive an electronic device to use for breathing tests and for eDiary entries.

Participants also can expect to:

- Attend clinic visits (up to 7, including a follow-up assessment).
- Have the required tests done in a timely manner.
- Make daily entries in an eDiary.
- Perform breathing tests, as directed.
- Allow enough time in your schedule for phone calls with study staff.



About Asthma

Asthma is a chronic disease of the airways in the lungs that can cause wheezing, shortness of breath, chest tightness and other symptoms. The CDC estimates that about 25.7 million adults and children in the United States have asthma.

There is no cure for asthma, but many people treat it through medication and other therapies. Unfortunately, about 58 percent of adults with asthma are unable to fully control their symptoms. This study aims to change that by providing a medication that is designed to be easier-to-use and may improve the quality of life of asthma patients.

Why Should I Participate?

Benefits

Taking part in this study may or may not make your asthma better. Knowledge gained from this study may help doctors better understand treatment for asthma, as well as determine who is more likely to as well as determine who is more likely to benefit from the medication and who is likely to have side effects.

As an eligible participant, you will receive study drugs and related tests at no cost to you.

Risks

There are risks and potential side effects associated with any medication. Your study doctor will discuss all potential risks with you prior to the start of the study.



Am I Eligible?

You may be eligible for this clinical study if you meet these basic requirements before the first prescreening visit:

- ✓ You are age 18 or older.
You have had an official diagnosis of asthma at least one year.
- ✓ Your asthma is inadequately controlled (ACQ-6 score ≥ 1.5) with maintenance therapy medications.
- ✓ You are not a current smoker and have not inhaled tobacco products within a year (cigarettes, e-cigarettes/vaping, cigars or pipe tobacco).
- ✓ You are not a former smoker with a smoking history of 20 or more cigarettes a day for 10+ years.

Note: These are not the only eligibility criteria for this clinical research study. A clinical research team member will help determine if you meet all necessary criteria to participate.

Explore an investigational drug that may provide relief for your Asthma symptoms.

Taking multiple medications to treat one condition can be a hassle, particularly if they do not provide the complete relief you need. Uncontrolled asthma may be your norm – but it doesn't have to be.

You have the opportunity to participate in a clinical research study that is being conducted to possibly ease the medication routine and provide more relief from symptoms.
